Domestic Violence Awareness Month

October is **Domestic Violence Awareness Month**. Are you confident in recognising the signs of domestic abuse and what to do if you or someone you know is the victim of domestic abuse?

Recognise domestic abuse

Does your partner, ex-partner or someone you live with:

- cut you off from family and friends and intentionally isolate you?
- bully, threaten, or control you?
- take control of your finances?
- monitor or limit your use of technology?
- physically and/or sexually abuse you?

Anyone can be a victim of domestic abuse, regardless of gender, age, ethnicity, religion, socio-economic status, sexuality or background.

Bright Sky app

[Bright Sky](#) is a free mobile app and website which provides support and information for anyone experiencing domestic abuse, or who is worried about someone else. Only download the app if it is safe for you to do so and if you are sure that your phone isn't being monitored.

Check whether someone has an abusive past

If you are concerned that a new, former or existing partner has an abusive past you can ask the police to check under the Domestic Violence Disclosure Scheme (also known as 'Clare's Law'). If records show that you may be at risk of domestic abuse, the police will consider disclosing the information. A disclosure can be made if it is legal, proportionate and necessary to do so.

If you are concerned about a friend or family member, you can apply for a disclosure on behalf of someone you know. Support agencies and services can also help you ask the police about this.

If you are worried that a friend, neighbour or loved one is a victim of domestic abuse, you can call the National Domestic Abuse Helpline for free and confidential advice, 24 hours a day on 0808 2000 247.

You said –Anti-social-behaviour (ASB).

Within the last month we have only had a few Anti –Social-Behaviour reports, concerning neighbour disputes ,these are being dealt with by the beat team and the local housing authority. It has come to our attention that youths are using Narborough Park, Littering and causing ASB, we have created an Anti-Social Behaviour report and patrolling after 7pm most evenings , we are also liaising with the local youth workers who will be in the area to speak with anyone within the parks.

You said -Road safety.

Foot patrols in all key areas identified by the residents have been completed and relevant advice and reassurance has been given. We are working alongside local parish councillors and the Local speeding operations have continued in Enderby village throughout the month and in Lubbesthorpe. E-Scoters will be our priority and we will be advising and giving warnings to anyone riding these in the village.

You said -Drug taking and Dealing.

The beat team have carried on with proactive patrols within the village. We manage this on a daily basis and anything that is reported will be actively patrolled, focusing on key times and days and gaining relevant information.

Please find updates from your local beat team in relation to the priorities you have raised via neighbourhood link:

You said we did- Road Safety -We have been actively patrolling our key hot spots in the area what the residents have highlighted through neighbourhood link. We recovered a vehicle from Enderby that was SORN but was still on the highway. Your local beat team have seen an increase in speeding motor vehicles this month so conducted a speeding operation which was very successful and dealt with a number of offending drivers.
